Serious security problems have recently been found in the Diebold optical-scan systems that we use in our state. Many independent studies have concluded that the election results cannot be trusted with our present system. The most recent Brennan Report clearly stated that our optical-scan system “poses a real danger to the integrity of national, state, and local elections.” Even the Democratic Party now states on their own website, “Diebold optical-scan machines have been proven to be vulnerable to tampering.” Vermont’s system is banned in Pennsylvania and other states.

Like the touch-screen machines, the optical-scan machines also have Diebold's “proprietary” software counting the votes. This is literally as if we are handing all the ballots to Diebold and allowing them to count the votes behind closed doors.

Citizens are asked to contact our Secretary of State and urge her to support legislation to bring us in full compliance with the recommendations of the Brennan Report.
